4. sympathetic	feeling and showing concern for others
5. affectionate	showing, indicating, or characterized by affection or love.
6. fervent	having or showing great warmth or intensity of spirit, feeling, enthusiasm
7. angry	feeling or showing strong annoyance, displeasure, or hostility; full of anger.
